- The <u>National Cohesive Wildland Fire Management Strategy</u> was released on 4/9. The Cohesive Strategy's analysis is relevant and useful to the issue of climate change as wildland fire and climate change share many parallel challenges.

- More than 200 participants attended the <u>Carolinas Climate Resilience Conference</u> in Charlotte, NC. Few resource managers attended, so sharing information and connections from meetings like this with managers is essential.

- Northeast Climate Science Center Director Mary Ratnaswamy recently toured NRS facilities in the upper Midwest and discussed opportunities for collaboration.

- On Earth Day, the Northeast Regional Climate Hub (NERCH) hosted a climate roundtable with Senator Shaheen along with governmental, academic, and non-governmental representatives.
